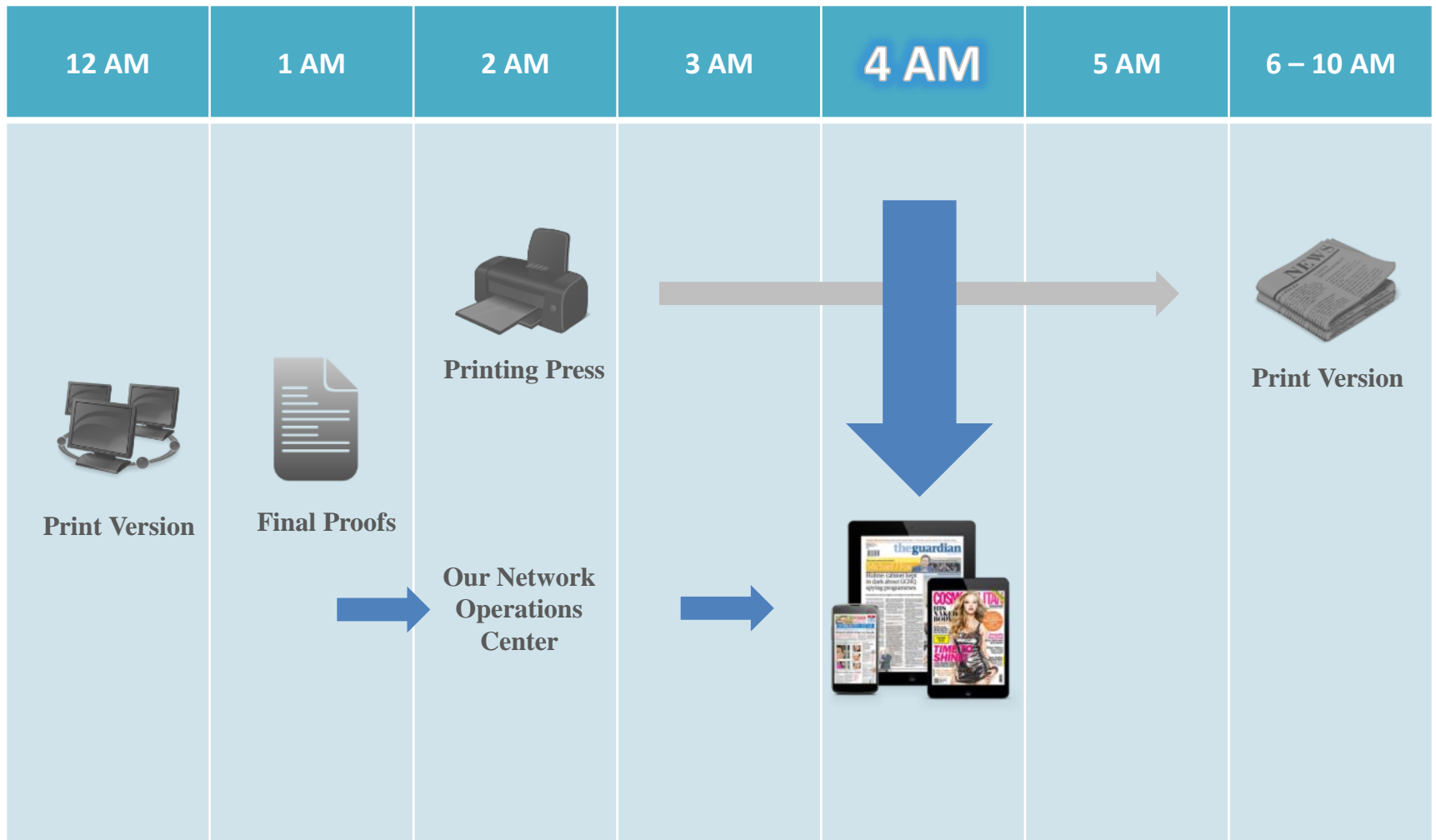

Brokers Cut Some Links To Barclays

Major brokers are shutting down their connections to a dark pool run by Barclays PLC following accusations of fraud against the bank in a lawsuit filed Wednesday by the New York attorney general, according to people familiar with the matter.

Broker-dealers including Deutsche Bank AG, Royal Bank of Canada and ITG have removed connections to the dark pool, called Barclays LX, from their routing systems, the people said. In some cases, the decision was a precautionary measure after the lawsuit was filed and in others it was the result of requests from large institutional investors, they said.

Brokers have been receiving calls from investors since the complaint against Barclays was made public Wednesday afternoon, said David Mechner, chief executive of Pragma Securities LLC, which sells computer models

to brokers and investors to help them trade stocks.

"We have had a lot of requests to turn them off," he said of Barclays LX.

Barclays was accused of lying to customers about how it favors high-frequency traders in its dark pool, according to the lawsuit filed by New York Attorney General Eric Schneiderman.

The lawsuit sent the bank's shares down 6.5% on Thursday and raised new questions about its chief executive's efforts to rebuild his institution's image.

In a memo sent to Barclays staff Thursday afternoon, CEO Antony Jenkins expressed his "deep disappointment and frustration that our business is back in the news this week for the wrong reasons."

Mr. Jenkins said the bank is conducting an internal investigation and has brought in "substantial external resources" to assist with that effort.

Google Acts on 'Forgotten' Rule

The Internet is starting to forget.

Google Inc. on Thursday started removing results from its search engine under Europe's new "right to be forgotten," implementing a landmark May ruling by the European Union's top court that gives individuals the

right to request removal of results that turn up in Internet searches for their own names.

Google engineers overnight updated the company's technical infrastructure to begin implementing the removals, and Thursday began sending the first emails to individuals informing them that links they had requested

were being taken down. The company has hired a dedicated "removals team" to evaluate each request, though only a small number of the initial wave of takedown requests has so far been processed.

"This week, we're starting to take action on the removal requests that we've received," a Google spokesman

"This is a new process for us. Each request has to be assessed individually, and we're working as quickly as possible to get through the queue."

Experts denounce Gove proposal to outsource children's protection to private firms

The power to take children away from their families could be privatised along with other child protection services under controversial plans the government has quietly announced.

The proposal from Michael Gove's Department for Education (DFE) to permit the outsourcing of children's social services in England to companies such as G4S and Serco has alarmed experts. They say profit-making companies should not be in charge of such sensitive family matters, and warn that the introduction of the profit motive into child protection may distort the decision-making process.

Two separate U.S. reports on the international students studying in the United States show that the number of Taiwanese studying in the U.S. has dropped markedly in recent years.

The number of Taiwanese students in the U.S. amounted to 21,867 in the 2012-2013 school year, down 6,150, or approximately 22 percent, from 28,017 people in the 2002-2003 school year, according to Ministry of Education (MOE) statistics, which were compiled based on data from the U.S.'s Institute of International Education.

The MOE has attributed the decline to the facts that more and more university graduates have been pursuing master's or doctoral degrees at local academic institutes rather than overseas, while there has also been a decline in the number of U.S. scholarships available for Taiwanese st

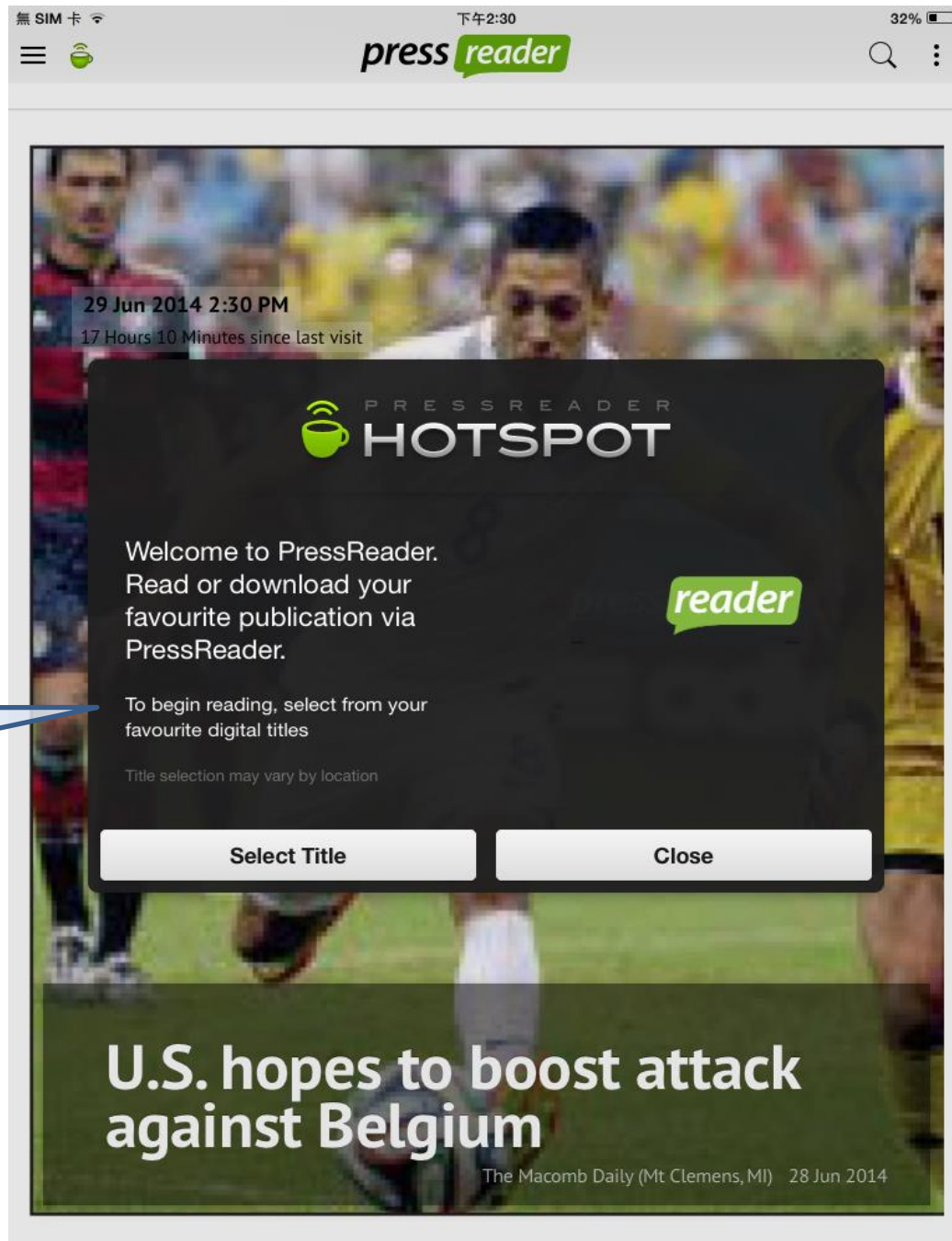

The Democratic Progressive Party's (DPP) newly-elected Chairman Tsai Ing-wen (left) proposed three major overhauled directions for the DPP to pursue after she took the reins from former Chairman Su Tsao-chang (right) yesterday.

The three guidelines are to gear up for the upcoming seven-in-one elections, to reform the DPP's think tank and to train more capable members to support the party. "We should strengthen our grass root energy and collaborate with more citizen groups in the future," Tsai said.

Tsai appears to have dropped all grudges against Su, saying that the rumors of their competition were not able to distract their passion for keeping the DPP going. "As a responsible political leader, one has to review the past ruling experiences... I have to reflect on the people's expectations of the DPP, so I have listed the three major missions," said Tsai.

The first mission will be to strive and win the 2014 elections, expanding the party's relationship with the society and to serve more supporters and joining future political reforms. Secondly, Tsai will be reforming the DPP's New Frontier Foundation. Aside from collaborating and communicating with citizen think tanks and citizen groups, the party will also work to establish good relationships with Taiwanese industries and financial organizations.

Last of all, the DPP will be training talented individuals to become future political leaders; the younger generation is en-

couraged to join the party.

Former Vice President Annette Lu (left) stressed Tsai to reform the ruling party, the parliament and the constitutional role of the nation. "Many of our constituents are like grandpa's pajamas that are discolored in the past," she said.

"I just left this post as I understand how difficult it is to lead the DPP; a lot of issues are not solved yet as the DPP had not been able to look China in the eye and this has affected its cross-strait policies... I have always turned into everything but in truth, many things should be taken slowly," said Su, who added that his party had been the future head of the media relations committee, while party spokesman Lin Chun-hsin (right) will be keeping his position as the U.S. representative.

Tsai named her office spokesperson Hung Yao-shi (right) and documentary director Liao Chang-ping (left) as the party's new deputy secretary general, former DPP lawmaker Chang Yun-ping (right) will be an advisor to the DPP's media relations committee, while party spokeswoman Lin Chun-hsin (right) will be keeping his position.

Fire kills 21 at South Korean hospital

A fire believed to have been set by an 81-year-old dementia patient blazed through a hospital ward for the elderly on Wednesday and killed 21 people in southern South Korea, including four smoke inhalation, police and fire officials said.

The fire on the second floor of the Hyosang Hospital in Jangjeong county also injured seven people and raised concerns about lax fire regulations at a time when the nation is undergoing soul-searching about public safety following last month's fiery sinking that killed more than 300 people.

Media reports noted that hospitals for the elderly such as Hyosang, which specializes in dementia and psychiatric patients, are not required to have sprinklers in South Korea despite a rapidly aging population.

That was the incident that reportedly show the danger of dementia on which our country is considered the world's second-highest dementia rate, said a Hankyoreh newspaper said in an editorial.

Security video showed the suspect entering the room where the blaze began and the patient's lighter went out in that event. The patient was seen running to a locked bathroom. Not seen the man, identified only by his surname Kim, denied responsibility.

The video footage showed the fire starting to spread from that room about two minutes after Kim ran, another police officer said, speaking to the Associated Press on condition of anonymity.

Hair on Kim's arm and hands were singed and he had covered back to his own room afterward and then quietly exited the hospital later, the police officer said.

There were 34 patients and two nurses on the hospital's second floor at the time of the blaze, and Jangjeong Fire Department officials said 20 of the patients and the nurses were killed, mostly from suffocation. They spoke of a condition of anonymity because of other cases.

More than 270 firefighters put the fire out after about six minutes.

Officials said that 45 people, including a nurse, were found on beds on the floor but none of them had their hands bound.

He said the second-floor ward doors are barred. Two hospital officials, speaking on condition of anonymity because they weren't authorized to talk to the media, also said that patients were not bound to beds.

The fire comes as South Korea debates long-ignored safety lapses in a country that rapidly rises from poverty and the destruction of the 1950-53 Korean War to become Asia's fourth biggest economy.

It is so early to say if safety lapses were involved in this fire.

But the recent fiery sinking has caused South Korea to re-evaluate cover issues long neglected as the country rises from poverty, war and dictating to an Asian powerhouse. The tragedy exposed regulatory failures that appear to have allowed the ferry South to set off with far more cargo than it could safely carry.

A fire earlier this week at a bus terminal here killed 21 people and injured 57.

China detains journalist, reason unclear

Foreign media workers Wednesday expressed alarm at Beijing's detention of a Chinese employee with a Japanese newspaper, the latest in a series of arrests before the 25th anniversary of the Tiananmen crackdown.

The Foreign Correspondents' Club of China said it was "alarmed and deeply concerned" by reports of the detention of Xin Jian, which "raise the disturbing possibility that she is being punished for the routine discharge of her professional duty on behalf of her employer." "The FCCC calls on the authorities to present evidence that Ms. Xin has broken the law or, in the absence of

such evidence, to release her immediately," it said in a statement.

Xin, an assistant for Japan's Nikkei newspaper working in the southwestern megacity of Chongqing, was taken away from her home by police on May 13, the paper said earlier.

She was detained on suspicion of "picking quarrels and provoking troubles," the paper said, citing a detention notice given by police to Xin's family on Monday.

The vague charge has been increasingly abused by the ruling Communist Party to round up dissenters, journalists and others it sees as a challenge to one-party rule,

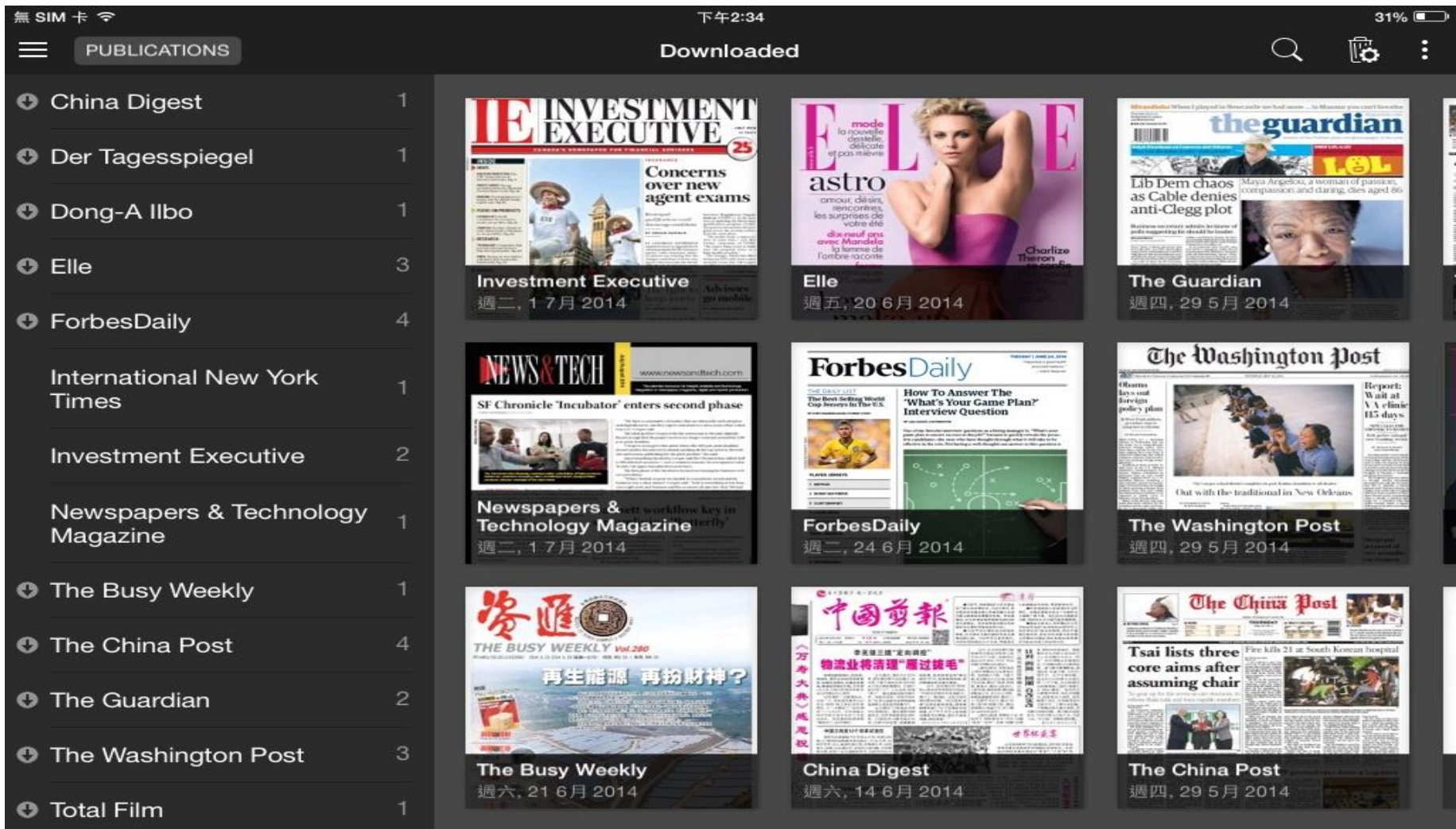
